

Logo File Usage Guide

Learn which file types and color spaces are best for your projects.



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INTRODUCTION

You've just been given a folder full of documents, files and images, and they all have different names. It looks like you have ten copies of the same logo! They all end with funny file extensions, like AI, EPS, PDF, JPG, PNG, OMG, WTH...right? Not to worry! We'll give you the low down on which files to use when and what exactly you can do with each file type.

FIRST THINGS FIRST, NOT ALL FILE TYPES ARE CREATED EQUAL.

There's a reason you have a couple different files of the same logo. Some are best for digital media and some are best used for physical media. Have a t-shirt you want your logo on? We have a file type for that. Want to send your logo to a charitable organization so they can use it on their website? We have a file type for that too.



RASTER VS. VECTOR

Let's break down the file types.

RASTER

Raster file types include **.jpg** and **.png**. Raster files, or images, are the same kind of images you take on your phone and are based on a dot matrix structure. This means raster files are based on little dots of color, or pixels, on a grid. Raster images are resolution dependent, meaning a raster image cannot be scaled up without losing some of its quality (enlarging a raster image eventually causes the image to become "pixelated" or blocky.) These images are best used at 100% scale and smaller.

Raster images can be used online or for print.

VECTOR

Vector files types include **.eps** and **.ai**. Vector files are based on polygons vs. pixels to create images. This means that vector images CAN be scaled up without losing their quality. The points and curves that make up the polygons (or, if you want to get nerdy, the mathematical formulas that create these polygons) can easily be readjusted to create a smaller or larger image while maintaining clean, crisp lines.

Vector images can be used for print.

Now that you know the two basic file formats, its time to go deeper into the matrix-erm, we mean file formatting world.

RASTER FILE TYPES

JPG

JPG (also known as JPEG files) are compressed raster files that are best used online but can also be used for smaller print jobs. Because of their size, JPG files allow web pages to load faster. JPG files will always have a white background, so if you're looking for a logo with a transparent background, read on.



PNG

PNG files are higher quality raster files. PNGs allow transparencies, meaning your logo will be featured on a transparent background. PNGs are also best for digital use, however be warned, as too many PNG files can slow down your website.



VECTOR FILE TYPES

EPS


EPS files are your standard vector file format. They are best used for any design elements or logos that need to be resized. EPS files are print ready but will need to be converted to a raster file in order to use online.

AI

Al files are branded version of EPS files, aka Adobe Illustrator's file format. This file type is most often used for "in-progress" work or for sharing with your printer, in case they need to make some changes to the file before printing.

PDF

Short for Portable Document Format, PDFs are used to share files with anyone from your printer to your audience. PDFs can be used for digital or for print, although you will most likely use your PDF logo file for print only.









COLOR SPACE

CMYK

This color space is based on four colors (cyan, magenta, yellow, and black). These are the file types your printer will use, whether you choose digital printing or traditional press printing. Think brochures, business cards, posters, etc.

File Types: AI, PDF, JPG, EPS

GRAYSCALE

This color space only uses one color (black). Use grayscale whenever printing in a black and white, for example newspaper ads.

File Types: AI, PDF, JPG, PNG, EPS

RGB


This color space is based on three colors (red, green, blue). You'll use this color format strictly online.


File Types: AI, PDF, TIF, JPG, PNG, EPS


PANTONE

This color space is based on the standardized color reproduction system called the Pantone Color Matching System. Pantone color swatches are used by manufacturers, printers and designers across the world in order to ensure colors match.

File Types: EPS, AI, PDF
